

Important Safety Information

- Always be careful when using your TV/VCR. To reduce the risk of fire, electrical shock, and other injuries, keep these safety precautions in mind when installing, using, and maintaining your machine.
 - Read all safety and operating instructions before operating the TV/VCR.
 - Retain the safety and operating instructions for future reference.
 - Heed all warnings on the TV/VCR and in the operating instructions.
 - Follow all operating and use instructions.
 - Unplug the TV/VCR from the wall outlet before cleaning. Use a damp cloth, do not use liquid or aerosol cleaners.
 - Never add any attachments and/or equipment without approval of the manufacturer. Such additions may result in the risk of fire, electric shock, or other personal injury.
 - Do not use the TV/VCR where contact with or immersion in water is a possibility, such as near bath tubs, sinks, washing machines, swimming pools, etc.
 - Do not place the TV/VCR on an unstable cart, stand, tripod, bracket, or table. The TV/VCR may fall, causing serious injury to a child or adult, and serious damage to the appliance. Use only with a cart, stand, tripod, bracket, or table recommended by the manufacturer or sold with the TV/VCR. Follow the manufacturer's instructions when mounting the unit, and use a mounting accessory recommended by the manufacturer. Move the TV/VCR and its cart with care. Quick stops, excessive force, and uneven surfaces may cause the unit and cart to overturn.
 - Provide ventilation for the TV/VCR The unit is designed with slots in the cabinet for ventilation to protect it from overheating. Do not block these openings with any object, and do not place the TV/VCR on a bed, sofa, rug, or other similar surface. Do not place it near a radiator or heat register. If you place the TV/VCR on a rack or bookcase, ensure that there is adequate ventilation and that you've followed the manufacturer's instructions for mounting.
 - Operate your TV/VCR only from the type of power source indicated on the marking label If you are not sure of the type of power supply to your home, consult your appliance dealer or local power company.

- Use only a grounded or polarized outlet. For your safety, this TV/VCR is equipped with a polarized alternating current line plug having one blade wider than the other. This plug will fit into the power outlet only one way. If you are unable to insert the plug fully into the outlet, try reversing the plug. If the plug still does not fit, contact your electrician to replace your outlet.
- Protect the power cord. Power supply cords should be routed so that they are unlikely to be walked on or pinched by items placed on or against them. Pay particular attention to cords at plugs, convenience receptacles, and the point where they exit from the unit.
- Unplug the TV/VCR from the wall outlet and disconnect the antenna or cable system during a lightning storm or when left unattended and unused for long periods of time. This will prevent damage to the unit due to lightning and power-line surges.
- Avoid overhead power lines. An outside antenna system should not be placed m the vicinity of
 overhead power lines or other electric light or power circuits or where it can fall into such
 power lines or circuits. When installing an outside antenna system, be extremely careful to keep
 from touching the power lines or circuits. Contact with such lines can be fatal.
- Do not overload the wall outlet or extension cords. Overloading can result in fire or electric shock.
- Do not insert foreign objects through openings in the unit, as they may touch dangerous voltage points or damage parts. Never spill liquid of any kind on the TV/VCR.
- Ground outdoor antennas. If an outside antenna or cable system is connected to the TV receiver, be sure the antenna or cable system is grounded so as to provide some protection against voltage surges and built-up static charges. Section 81.0 of the National Electrical Code, ANSI/NFPA No. 70-1984, provides information with respect to proper grounding of the mast and supporting structure, grounding of the lead-in wire to an antenna discharge unit, size of grounding conductors, location of antenna-discharge unit, connection to grounding electrodes, and requirements for the grounding electrode.



- Do not attempt to service the TV/VCR yourself. Refer all servicing to qualified service personnel
 Unplug the unit from the wall outlet and refer servicing to qualified service personnel under the
 following conditions.
 - when the power-supply cord or plug is damaged
 - if liquid has been spilled on the unit or if objects have fallen into the unit
 - if the TV/VCR has been exposed to rain or water
 - If the TV/VCR does not operate normally by following the operating instructions
 - if the TV/VCR has been dropped or the cabinet has been damaged
 - when the TV/VCR exhibits a distinct change in performance

If you make adjustments yourself, adjust only those controls that are covered by the operating instructions. Adjusting other controls may result in damage and will often require extensive work by a qualified technician to restore the TV/VCR to normal.

- When replacement parts are required, be sure the service technician uses replacement parts specified by the manufacturer or those that have the same characteristics as the original part Unauthorized substitutions may result in additional damage to the unit.


Installation

In this chapter, you will learn to connect your TV/VCR. Choose which of the following situations applies to your system, and follow the step-by-step instructions to set up your new TV/VCR.

➤ Connecting VHF and UHF Antennas to the TV/VCR

If you do not have cable TV, you will connect the TV/VCR to one or more antennas. Before connecting, however, you must determine what type of lead your antenna has (The "lead" is the end of the antenna cable).

If your lead looks like this, you have a *300-ohm flat twin lead*. (This is the type of lead on the rod antenna included with the unit).



If your lead looks like this. you have a 75-ohm round lead. (This is the type of lead on a coaxial cable).




Antennas with 300-ohm Flat Twin Leads

The rod antenna included with your TV/VCR (except models CXD2512, CXD2514) uses 300-ohm twin flat leads. If you are using a different antenna (like a roof antenna) that also has 300-ohm twin flat leads, follow the directions below, but skip the first step



If you want to use the included rod antenna, push the stem of the antenna into the antenna mount at the top of the back panel.





Place the wires from the antenna under the screws on the 300-75 ohm adaptor (included). Use a screwdriver to tighten the screws.

Plug the adaptor into the terminal on the bottom of the back panel.


Extend the rod antenna completely, and adjust its position for the clearest picture.

Antennas with 75-ohm Round Leads


Plug the antenna lead into the terminal on the bottom of the back panel.



Separate VHF and UHF Antennas


If you have two separate antennas for your TV/VCR (one VHF and one UHF), you must combine the two wires into one in order to connect the TV/VCR. This procedure requires a combiner attachment. You'll find the type of combiner you need at an electronics store.

Push the stem of the VHF rod antenna (if applicable) unto the antenna mount at the top of the rear panel.







Connecting Cable TV Systems to the TV/VCR

Your cable-ready TV/VCR has a built-in 181-channel tuner that can receive all 68 VHF/UHF channels plus basic cable channels without an external cable converter box. If your cable company does not scramble its channels, use these instructions to connect cable to your TV.

Cable without a Converter Box



■ Because your new TV/VCR is cable-ready, you don't need a cable box converter for basic cable channels.

Cable with a Converter Box


If your cable company scrambles some channels and requires you to use a converter box for only those channels, use these instructions to connect cable to your TV. You will need the following pieces of equipment:

- · A 2-way splitter
- · An RF (A/B) switch
- Four lengths of coaxial cable

You can find these accessories at most electronics supply stores.




Plug the incoming cable into the 2-way splitter.






Connect a 3 second coaxial cable between the out terminal of the converter box and the "B" terminal on the RF (A/B) switch.



Connect the fourth coaxial cable between the terminal on the RF {A/B} switch and the terminal on the TV/VCR's back panel.




TV/VCR Rear

Choose the "A" position on the A/B switch to select all non-scrambled channels by remote control. Choose the "B" position on the A/B switch to select scrambled channels via the converter box When using the "B" position, tune your TV to the output channel of the converter box (usually channel 3 or 4)

Installing Batteries in the Remote Control



Open the battery compartment by pressing down on the back cover's tab, then sliding it off.

Install two AAA size batteries (included with your TV/VCR).



■ Make sure to match the "+" and
"-" ends of the batteries with the
diagram inside the compartment.

3 Replace the cover.



→ Remove the batteries and store them in a cool, dry place if you won't be using the remote control for a long time.

The remote control can be used up to about 33 feet (10 meters) from the TV/VCR

Batteries last for about one year.


T V OPERATION

In this chapter, you will learn how to use the TV features of your TV/VCR unit. You will set up your TV, completing procedures such as storing channels in memory and setting the clock and calendar Then you will learn how to use convenience features such as customizing your picture settings, and setting the sleep timer.

▶ Viewing the On-Screen Display


The on-screen displays automatically appear on the screen when you turn on the TV/VCR or change its status (from stop to play, from play to stop, etc.). You can also activate the on-screen displays manually by using the remote control.

With the power on, press **DISPLAY**.



The on screen display items appear on the screen.

If you have a video tape in the TV/VCR, the display includes the status of this tape (Stop, Play, etc.).




■ This on-screen display disappears from the screen after less than ten seconds.

If there is no tape in the TV/VCR, the tape status will read, "No tape."

Press **DISPLAY** again (while the display items are still on the TV/VCR screen) to display the time counter.

Press **DISPLAY** again to display the counter memory.



►Inserting and Ejecting a Video Cassette Tape

To insert a video cassette tape,


Hold the video cassette tape window side up with the arrow pointing away from you.

Gently push the tape through the compartment door until you feel the VCR pull it

The TV/VCR loads the tape automatically.



■ Don't try to insert a tape upside down or backwards.



TROUBLESHOOTING

Before you call a repair person for your TV/VCR, please scan this list of possible problems and solutions. It may save you time and money.

entifying TV Problems

Problem	Possible Solution
Poor picture, no picture, blurred picture, or blue screen.	Try another channel. Make sure the unit is plugged into a working wall outlet. Adjust the antenna. Press LINE IN. Check all wire connections.
Poor sound quality.	Try another channel. Adjust the antenna.
No color, wrong colors or tints.	Make sure the program is broadcast in color. Adjust the picture settings.
Picture rolls vertically.	Adjust the antenna. Check all wire connections.

i......Identifying VCR Problems

Problem	Possible Solution
Unit won't turn on.	Make sure the unit is plugged into a working wall outlet. Press the POWER button.
Unit won't take video tape.	Make sure the tape is window-side up with the arrow pointing away from you. Make sure there's no other tape in the compartment.
Unit didn't record a program.	Make sure the antenna or cable is connected and that the TV/VCR is receiving the broadcast signal. Make sure the record safety tab is intact.
Unit didn't record a timer program.	Make sure the unit was turned off. Check the programmed start and stop times. Make sure the time is set correctly.
There is no picture, the picture is distorted during video tape playback, or there is noise or streaks in the picture.	Adjust the tracking. Clean the video heads. Make sure there has been a recording on the tape.

TROUBLESHOOTING

Problem	Possible Solution
You can't receive regular broadcasts.	Check the antenna or cable connections.
Rewind command doesn't work.	Make sure the VCR is not in pause mode. Make sure the tape hasn't already been rewound.
Fast forward command doesn't work.	Make sure the VCR is not in pause mode. Make sure the tape hasn't already been forwarded.
Picture is streaked during pause mode.	This is normal for SP and LP recordings.

Cleaning and Maintaining Your TV/VCR

With proper care, your TV/VCR unit will give you may years of service. Please follow these guidelines to get the maximum performance from your TV/VCR.

Placement

- Do not place the TV/VCR near extremely hot, cold, humid or dusty places.
- Do not place the TV/VCR near appliances with electric motors that create magnetic fields, such as vacuum cleaners.
- Keep the ventilation openings clear, do not place the TV/VCR on a soft surface, such as cloth or paper.
- Place the TV/VCR in a vertical position only.

Liquids

• Do not handle liquids near or on the TV/VCR Liquids that spill into it can cause serious damage.

Cabinet

- Never open the cabinet or touch the parts inside.
- Wipe your TV/VCR with a clean, dry cloth Never use water, cleaning fluids, wax, or chemicals.
- Do not put heavy objects on top of the cabinet.

Video Heads

- Obtain a head cleaning tape from your local video dealer to clean dirt that accumulates on the video heads
- Be sure to follow instructions that come with the cleaning tape, as excessive use of a cleaning tape can shorten head life.

Temperature

• If your TV/VCR is suddenly moved from a cold to a warm place, unplug the power cord, and allow at least two hours for moisture that may have formed on the tape and inside the unit to dry completely.

Choosing the Proper Tapes

Use only video cassette tapes marked VHS with this TV/VCR Choose good quality tapes for best results.

Caring for Video Cassette Tapes

- . Keep the tapes away from direct sunlight, heat or extreme cold.
- Insert tapes with the window side up and the arrow pointing away from you.
- Do not subject tapes to violent vibrations or shocks.
- Never try to take apart or splice a video tape.
- Do not open the cassette, touch the tape, or put anything inside the video tape cartridge.
- Read the instructions supplied with a video tape.

Choosing the Correct Recording Speed

Your TV/VCR is equipped with variable tape speed. You can play or record a tape at.

- SP (Standard Play)— the fastest speed,
- LP (Long Play), or
- SLP (Super Long Play)— the slowest speed

When you are playing a tape, your TV/VCR automatically selects the proper speed, even if segments of the tape have been recorded at a different speed

When you are recording, the slower the tape speed you use, the longer the tape runs and the more program material it holds SP provides the clearest record/playback picture, but special effects such as still picture work best in the SLP mode

Use this chart to determine which tape speed to select when you are recording



Using the Record Safety Tab

Most video cassette tapes have a safety tab that prevents accidental erasure. The safety tab is on the end of the tape opposite from where the arrow points.

The tab must be intact to record You can record over and over on the same tape as long as the tab is intact. If you want to protect a tape from accidental erasure, break off the tab with a screwdriver, as shown here.

If you wish to erase a recorded tape or to record on a cassette with the tab removed, cover the hole with cellophane tape.



Sending Tapes to Another Country

Because various TV standards are used throughout the world, we recommend that you check for compatibility before sending your tapes to a foreign country Tapes made on machines sold in the U. S. A can be played back only on units that use the NTSC television system.

Using Your TV/VCR in Another Country

If you plan to take your TV/VCR with you to a foreign country, be aware of the different television systems that are in use around the world. A TV/VCR designed for one system may not work properly with another system due to differences in the TV channel frequencies.
